A NOTE FROM A GUEST . . .

My name is Joanne and I am fifty-one years old. This is my story. In November of 2015 I was admitted to the Brattleboro Retreat, broken and exhausted. I was an active substance abuser, in an abusive marriage, and severely mentally ill. I would be held on a court order for the next 95 days. Christmas Eve two sheriffs served me divorce papers and I was ordered out of the house. I was also now homeless.

A dear friend found the Shelter From The Storm program. She contacted them. My friend got the process of being accepted into the Shelter program started, while I recovered. The end of January I was finally released from the Retreat. This is when I first met Linda Harris and her team.

I was accepted to the program and moved into one of Shelter's apartments in February of 2016. I was facing a lot of issues – homelessness, financial insecurities and new sobriety. Shelter was very supportive. Over the next 8 months Shelter would help me budget and save money, assist me with housing applications, and offer me emotional support. I excelled. In October of 2016 I moved into my first apartment with great support from Shelter. I remained there for about a year. Finally one of the subsidized apartments Shelter helped me apply for came through. I moved into a beautiful, quiet, affordable apartment! It is now 2019. Today I am sober, financially sound and happy. I owe so much to the program. I wouldn't have made it without them! Shelter From The Storm saved my life!
